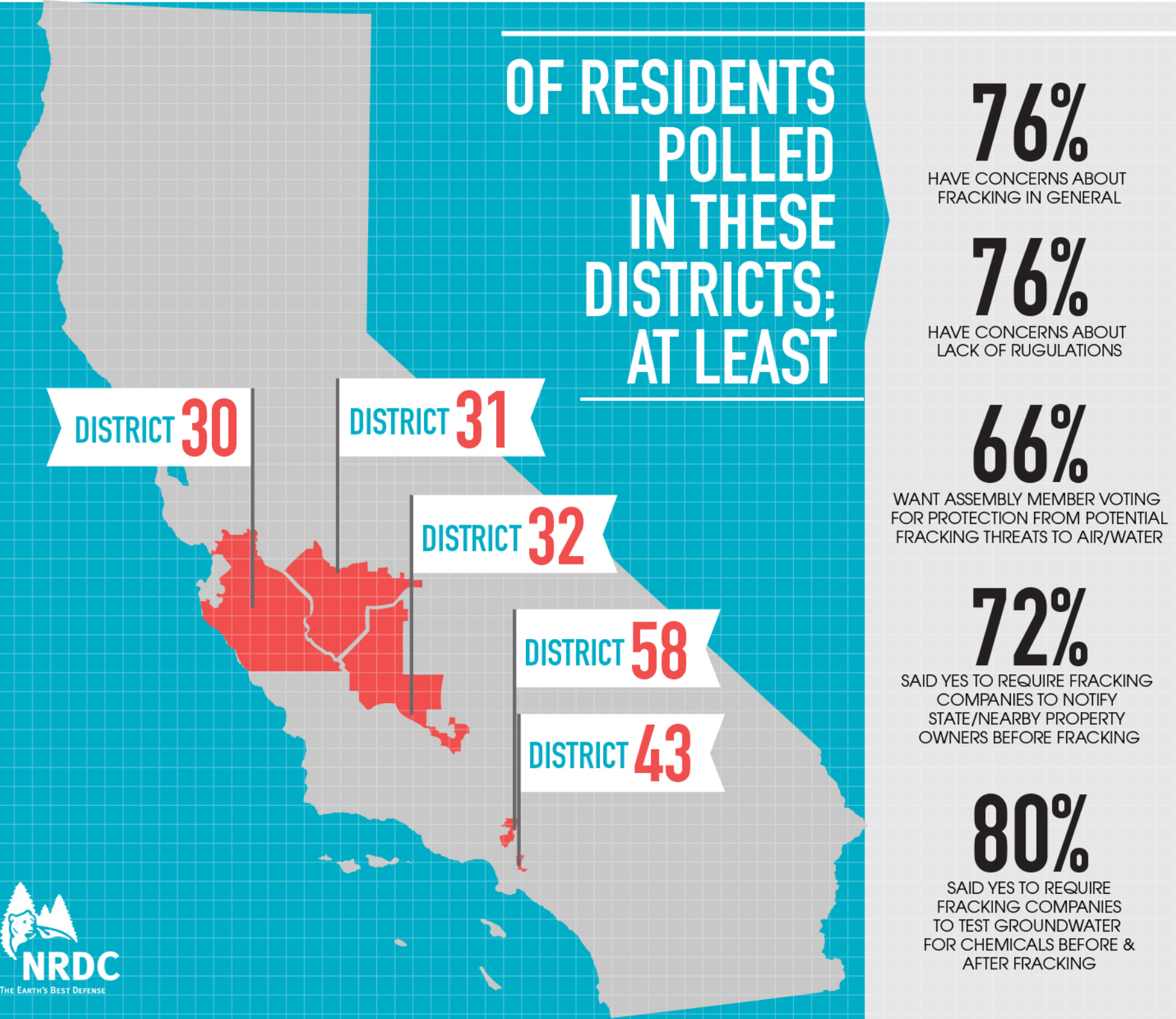







CALIFORNIANS ARE CONCERNED ABOUT FRACKING

New polling shows that more than three-quarters of residents polled in California’s 30th, 31st, 32nd, 43rd, and 58th assembly districts have concerns about fracking. Nearly half of residents polled in each district say their concerns are very serious. More than 75% of respondents in each district also have concerns about the lack of regulation of fracking in California, and more than half of Republican respondents in each district share these concerns.

* The poll was conducted by Public Policy Polling in five key California State Assembly districts that are impacted by fracking and key to passing protective fracking legislation. It was conducted among voters from both major political parties and represented different age groups and ethnicities. The polling took place from August 8 through 12, and has a margin of error of +/- 4-4.4 percentage points.
