Q1 How likely would you say you are to vote in this year's elections for Congress and other offices? Are you certain to vote, will you probably vote, are the chances 50/50, or will you probably not vote?

Q2 The Clean Water Act was passed overwhelmingly by Republicans and Democrats in 1972, and it protects water bodies from being irresponsibly polluted or destroyed. Would you say you support or oppose this law?

Would you say this lack of protection gives you very serious concerns, somewhat serious concerns, minor concerns, or no real concerns about water pollution?
